

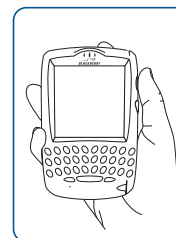

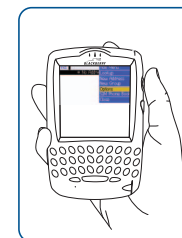
To	Do this
HANDHELD	
Turn on the handheld	Press the Power button
Turn off the handheld	Hold the Power button <i>OR</i> Click the Turn Power Off icon
Turn on/off the radio	Click the Turn Wireless On/Turn Wireless Off icon
Turn on/off backlighting	Press the Power button
Lock the handheld	Click the Lock icon*
Lock the keyboard	Click the Keyboard Lock icon
Unlock the keyboard	Double-click the trackwheel
*The Lock icon appears when a password is set.	
NAVIGATING	
Move the cursor	Roll the trackwheel <i>OR</i> Press the Alt key + roll the trackwheel
Click an item	Highlight the item > Click the trackwheel
Return to the previous screen	Press the Escape button
Move backward/forward	Press the Back/Forward key
Select multiple items	Hold the Shift key + roll the trackwheel
Move to the top of a screen	Press T
Move to the bottom of a screen	Press B
Move to an item in a list or menu	Press the first letter of the item
Page up or down in a list	Press the Alt key + roll the trackwheel
TYPING TEXT	
Capitalize a letter	Hold the letter
Insert a period	Press the Space key twice
Type the alternate character on a key	Press the Alt key + the key
Insert a special character	Hold a letter + roll the trackwheel
Insert a symbol	Press the Symbol key > Click a symbol
Enter CAP-lock mode	Press the Alt key + the Right Shift key
Enter NUM-lock mode	Press the Right Shift key + the Alt key
Exit NUM-lock or CAP-lock mode	Press the Right Shift key
EDITING TEXT	
Enter selection mode	Press the Alt key + click the trackwheel
Select text	Enter selection mode > Roll the trackwheel
Select one character	Enter selection mode > Hold the Shift key + roll the trackwheel
Copy selected text	Press the Alt key + click the trackwheel <i>OR</i> Click the trackwheel > Click Copy
Paste selected text	Press the Shift key + click the trackwheel <i>OR</i> Click the trackwheel > Click Paste
Cut selected text	Press the Shift key + the Backspace key <i>OR</i> Click the trackwheel > Click Cut
MISCELLANEOUS	
Search for text	Click the trackwheel > Click Find > Type text
Clear a field	Click the trackwheel > Click Clear Field
Move an icon on the Home screen	Press the Alt key > Click the trackwheel > Click Move Icon > Position the icon > Click the trackwheel

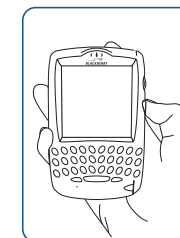

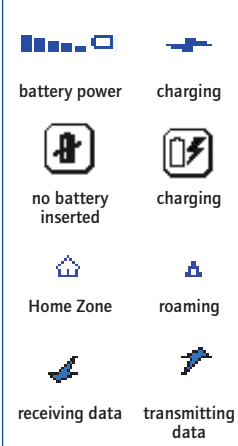

- On the Home screen, click the **Compose** icon.

- Click **[Use Once]**. A menu appears.
- Click **Email**. The One Time Email screen appears.
- In the **Email** field, type an email address.
- Click the trackwheel. A menu appears.
- Click **Continue**.
- In the **Subject** field, type a subject.
- Press the **Enter** key.
- Type a message.
- Click the trackwheel. A menu appears.
- Click **Send**. The message is sent.

INSTALL AND SET UP THE DESKTOP SOFTWARE

Select how your handheld will work with your email account:

- If you integrate your handheld with a business email account to extend a Microsoft Outlook® or Lotus Notes® mailbox that has access to a BlackBerry Enterprise Server or to extend your Microsoft Outlook mailbox using the BlackBerry Desktop Redirector, complete the steps in Section 1a.
- If you integrate your handheld with a new email account or with your existing Internet service provider (ISP) email account using the BlackBerry Web Client, complete the steps in Section 1b.
- If you integrate your handheld with more than one type of email account using the BlackBerry Enterprise Server or BlackBerry Desktop Redirector as well as the BlackBerry Web Client, complete the steps in Section 1a followed by the steps in Section 1b.

BLACKBERRY ENTERPRISE SERVER AND BLACKBERRY DESKTOP REDIRECTOR

1. Install the BlackBerry Desktop Software

If you use Microsoft Outlook, ask your system administrator whether a BlackBerry Enterprise Server or BlackBerry Desktop Redirector will redirect your email messages.

- a) Insert the BlackBerry Desktop Software installation CD into your CD-ROM drive.
- b) Complete the on-screen instructions.

2. Generate an encryption key

- a) Verify that your handheld is connected to your computer.
- b) On the Windows taskbar, click **Start**.
- c) Select **Programs > BlackBerry > Desktop Manager**. The BlackBerry Desktop Manager window appears. A dialog box appears.
- d) Complete the on-screen instructions.

3. Enable email redirection

- **BlackBerry Enterprise Server:** Email is forwarded to your handheld automatically.
- **BlackBerry Desktop Redirector:** On the Windows taskbar, click **Start**. Select **Programs > BlackBerry > BlackBerry Desktop Redirector**. The BlackBerry Desktop Redirector must be running for email to be forwarded to your handheld.

Email program requirements

- Microsoft Outlook® (Workgroup installation), with an email account on a Microsoft® Exchange Server version 5.5 or later
- Lotus Notes® version 4.6 or later, with an email account on a Lotus® Domino™ Server version 4.6 or later

BLACKBERRY WEB CLIENT

1. Create a BlackBerry Web Client account

- a) To create a BlackBerry Web Client account, contact your service provider.

2. Install the BlackBerry Desktop Software (optional)

- a) Insert the BlackBerry Desktop Software installation CD into your CD-ROM drive.
- b) Complete the on-screen instructions.

Browser requirements

- Netscape® Navigator version 4.08, 4.58, or later (not Netscape Navigator 5.0)
- Microsoft Internet Explorer version 5.01, 5.5, 6.0, or later

INSERT THE SIM CARD

Your SIM card might be inserted already.



Warning: Turn off your handheld before you insert or remove the SIM card. Do not scratch, bend, or expose the SIM card to static electricity or wet conditions.

1. Press the battery cover release button.
2. Slide off the cover.
3. If the battery is inserted, remove it.
4. Slide the SIM card holder to the left.
5. Lift the SIM card holder.
6. Insert the SIM card into the holder so that the notches align.
7. Close the SIM card holder.
8. Slide the SIM card holder to the right to lock it.

3 INSERT THE BATTERY

Warning: Use only the battery that Research In Motion specifies for use with your handheld.

1. Press the battery cover release button.
2. Slide off the cover.
3. Insert the battery so that the connectors align.
4. Replace the battery cover. Your handheld turns on, and a dialog box appears.*
5. Click **OK**.

*If your handheld does not turn on, or if the date and time are incorrect, refer to "Troubleshooting."

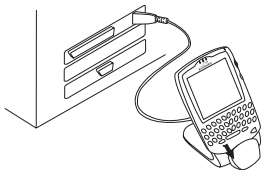
4 CHARGE THE BATTERY

Warning: Use only the cradle that Research In Motion specifies for use with your handheld.

1. Select one of the following options:

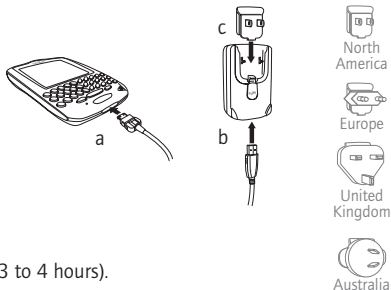
Use the cradle and your computer

- a) Connect the larger end of the USB cable to an available USB port on your computer.
- b) Insert the handheld into the cradle.



Use the travel charger

- a) Connect the larger end of the travel charger cable to your handheld.
- b) Connect the smaller end of the travel charger cable to the power adapter.
- c) Insert the appropriate attachment piece into the power adapter.
- d) Plug the power adapter into a power outlet.



2. Let the battery charge to full power (approximately 3 to 4 hours).

Tip: To keep the battery at a full charge, charge it for 10 to 15 minutes every day.

5 TURN ON THE RADIO

1. On the Home screen, click the **Turn Wireless On** icon.

Tip: To turn off the radio, on the Home screen, click the **Turn Wireless Off** icon.

Troubleshooting

Problem	Possible Solution
The handheld is not on.	Press the Power button.
The handheld does not turn on.	Charge the handheld. Reinsert the battery.
The handheld does not charge.	Check all connections.
The date and time are incorrect.	Refer to "Set the date and time" in the <i>BlackBerry Wireless Handheld User Guide</i> .
The handheld is PIN-locked.	Contact your service provider.
Other issues.	Refer to "Troubleshooting" in the <i>BlackBerry Wireless Handheld User Guide</i> .
