## get started

### battery

#### install the battery

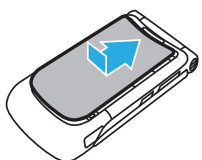
- 1 Press the battery cover release button. While still pressing the button, slide the cover down slightly and lift it off the phone.



- 2 With the gold contacts facing down and toward the lower end of the battery, insert the battery, lower end first.



- 3 Fit the battery cover back onto the phone and slide it forward into place.



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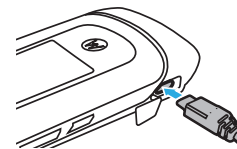
## get started

### charge the battery

New batteries are not fully charged. Before you can use your phone, install and charge the battery. Some batteries perform best after several full charge/discharge cycles.

#### Using the charger:

- 1 Insert the charger into your phone's micro USB connector. Plug the other end of the charger into an electrical outlet.



- 2 When you see **Charge Complete**, unplug the charger.

When you charge the battery, the battery level indicator at the upper right of the screen shows charging progress. At least one segment of the indicator must be visible to ensure full phone functionality while charging.

#### Charging from your computer:

##### Note: Optional accessories required.

You can charge the battery by connecting a cable from your phone's micro USB port to a high-power USB connector on a computer (not a low-power one, such as

the USB connector on your keyboard or bus-powered USB hub). Typically, USB high-power connectors are located directly on your computer.

Both your phone and your computer must be turned on, and you must have correct software drivers installed on your computer. Cables and software drivers are available in Motorola Original™ data kits, sold separately.

**Note:** For battery use and battery safety information, see your *User's Guide*.

#### Notes for charging your phone's battery:

- When charging your battery, keep it near room temperature. Never expose batteries to temperatures below 0°C (32°F) or above 45°C (113°F) when charging.
- New batteries are not fully charged.
- New batteries or batteries stored for a long time may take more time to charge.
- Motorola batteries and charging systems have circuitry that protects the battery from damage from overcharging.

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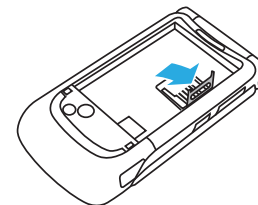
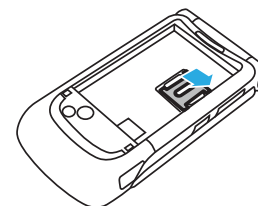

### memory card

#### Note: Optional accessory required.

#### install & remove memory card

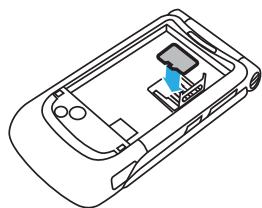
- 1 Remove the battery door from your phone (see page 9). If necessary, remove the battery.
- 2 Slide the memory card cover back to unlock it, then lift it to expose the opening for the memory card.



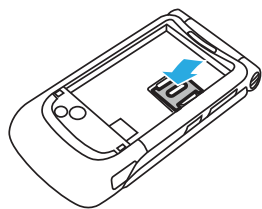

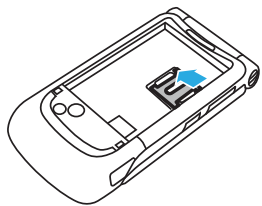
- 3 With the gold contacts down, place the memory card into the card opening.



- 4 Close the memory card cover, then slide it forward to lock it into place.



- 5 Replace the battery and battery door.



**Caution:** Don't remove your memory card while your phone is using it or writing files to it.

**To remove the memory card**, slide the cover back to unlock it, then lift the cover and remove the card.

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## get started

### format memory card

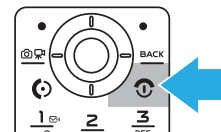
**Caution:** Formatting the memory card erases any data stored on the card.

**Find it:** > Settings > Storage Device

- 1 Select **Memory Card** and press the center key .
- 2 Select **Format Memory Card** and press the center key .

### turn phone on & off

**To turn on your phone**, press and hold for a few seconds or until the display turns on. If prompted, enter your four-digit unlock code.



**To turn off your phone**, press and hold for two seconds.

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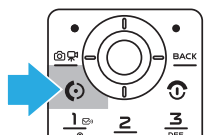

### make & answer calls

**To make a call**, enter a phone number and press .

**To answer a call**, when your phone rings and/or vibrates, just open the flip or press .

**To hang up**, close the flip or press .

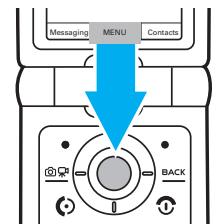

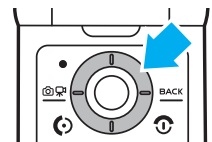

### getting around

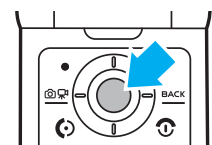
- 1 Press the *center key* to open the **Main Menu**.

- 3 Press the *center key* to select the highlighted option.

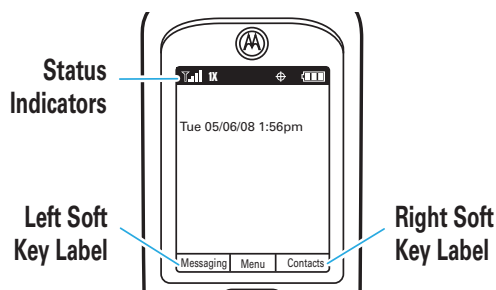

## home screen

Your phone shows the *home screen* when you are not on a call or using the menu:



**Note:** Your home screen might look different from the one shown, depending on your service provider.

*Soft key labels* in the home screen show the current soft key functions. *Indicators* provide important status information. See your *User's Guide* for more information about status indicators.

# personalize

## home screen shortcuts

From the home screen, you can press the navigation key up, down, left, or right as shortcuts to your favorite features. You can **change** the shortcuts to suit your needs:

**Find it:** > Settings > Phone > Shortcuts

Select a direction, then choose the feature you want to open when you press the navigation key in that direction.

You can **show** or **hide** icons in the home screen that indicate the shortcuts for the navigation key.

**Find it:** > Settings > Phone > Shortcuts > Show Shortcuts

**Note:** You can press to select the features in the home screen even when the icons are hidden.

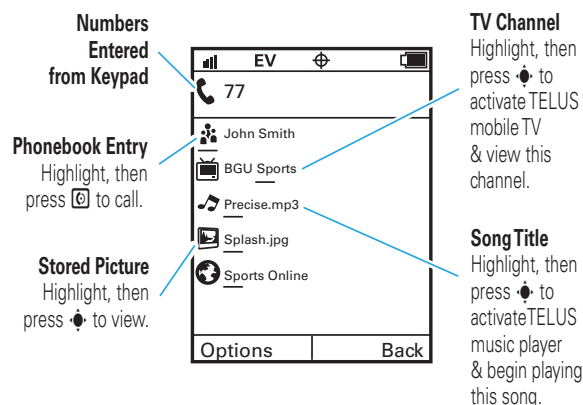
## TELUS Quick Find Powered by *i* | QiX™

**Note:** TELUS Quick Find must be set to **On** in order for TELUS Quick Find Powered by *i* | QiX™ to work.

TELUS Quick Find Powered by *i* | QiX™ is a discovery tool that helps you access the full range of features and services on your phone, quickly and easily, without having to remember where or how to locate them.

From the home screen, use the keypad to enter the name of a song, a phonebook entry, a filename for a video clip, menu options, or other items. As you enter letters, TELUS Quick Find Powered by *i* | QiX™ will present you with a list of songs, phonebook entries, pictures, and other items that match the letters you enter.

## ringtones

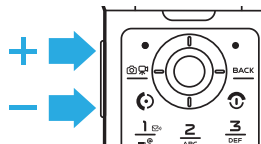
To set ringtones for incoming calls and for other events (such as new messages):

**First**, set **Master Volume** to **High**, **Med High**, **Medium**, **Low Med**, **Low**, or **1 Beep**.

**Next**, select and assign ringtones.

### set master volume

From the home screen, press the volume keys up or down to select a **Master Volume** setting:



**High**, **Med High**, **Medium**, **Low Med**, **Low**—Phone rings for incoming calls and other events, depending on the detail settings.

**1 Beep**—Phone beeps once to indicate an incoming call.

**Vibrate Only**—Phone vibrates to indicate an incoming call.

**Alarm Only**—Phone plays an audible alarm to alert you to events. You can't change detail settings for events.

**All Sounds Off**—Phone does not alert you to incoming calls and events.

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# personalize

## select ringtones

To assign ringtones for calls:

**Find it:** > Settings > Sounds > Call Ringtone

❶ Select **Single Tone** to assign a single ringtone to incoming calls.

or

Select **Shuffle Multiple** to select downloaded ringtones to play randomly for incoming calls.

**Note:** **Contacts** entries with assigned Ringer IDs will not be affected. The **Shuffle Multiple** option works only with downloaded ringtones and depletes your battery's charge more quickly than **Single Tone**.

❷ If you selected **Single Tone**, scroll to the ringtone you want and press .

**Note:** Your phone plays each ringtone that you highlight.

or

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# personalize

If you selected **Shuffle Multiple**, scroll to each downloaded ringtone you want and press . After you select all of the ringtones you want, press **Done**.

❸ Press to return to the home screen.

To assign ringtones for incoming text, multimedia, or voicemail messages:

**Find it:** > Settings > Sounds

❶ Select **Message Ringtone** or **Voicemail Ringtone**.

❷ Scroll to the ringtone you want and press the center key .

**Note:** Your phone plays each ringtone that you highlight.

❸ Press to return to the home screen.

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# personalize

## wallpaper

Set a photo, picture, or animation as a wallpaper (background) image in your home screen.

**Find it:** > Settings > Display > Wallpaper

❶ Select **Main Screen** (the screen you see when the flip is open) or **Front Screen** (the screen you see with the flip closed) and press the center key .

❷ To assign a single picture as a wallpaper, select **Single** and press the center key .

or


To select downloaded or captured pictures to be shown randomly as wallpapers, select **Shuffle Multiple** and press the center key . Acknowledge the message about **Shuffle Multiple** by pressing the center key .

❸ If you selected **Single**, scroll to the desired picture and press the center key .

or

If you selected **Shuffle Multiple**, scroll to each downloaded or captured picture you want and press the center key . When you have selected all of the pictures you want, press **Done**.

- 4 Press  to return to the home screen.

## skins

Set the overall look and feel of your phone's screen.

**Find it:**  >  **Settings** > **Display** > **Skins**

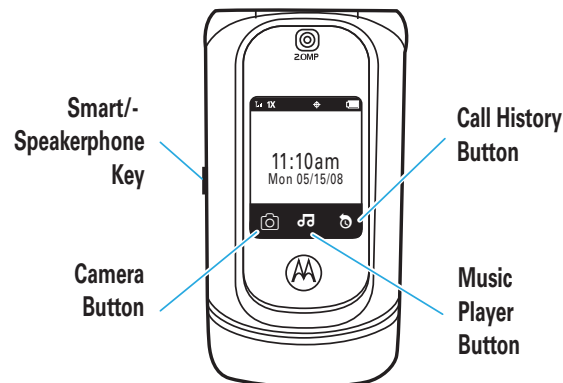
- 1 Scroll to the name of a skin and press the center key .
- 2 Press  to return to the main screen.

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# touch sensitive buttons

## using touch sensitive buttons

With your phone's flip closed, you can use touch sensitive buttons to view recent calls, play music, or turn on Bluetooth® power.



**To activate the touch sensitive buttons, press the smart/speakerphone key.**

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# touch sensitive buttons

**Note:** If the external display is not already lit, press the smart/speakerphone key once to turn it back on, and a second time to activate the touch sensitive buttons.

**Whenever you press** a touch sensitive button or touch control, **you'll feel a vibration** that confirms your selection.

**If the external display times out** while you are using the touch sensitive buttons or touch controls, **press the smart/speakerphone key** to turn it back on.

**Tip:** Lock the touch sensitive buttons when you aren't using them so you don't accidentally activate them when the flip is closed. **To lock** the touch sensitive buttons, **press and hold the smart/speakerphone key**. Press and hold the smart/speakerphone key again to unlock the touch sensitive buttons.


## touch camera

**To activate the phone's camera**, press and hold the camera button. Your phone shows the camera viewfinder screen on the external display. Use the touch controls to zoom in and out and take a photo (see page 41).


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# touch sensitive buttons


## touch music player

**To activate TELUS mobile music or to resume music playback after closing the flip**, press the music player button . Use the touch controls that appear on the screen to control music playback (see the next section).

## touch recent calls

**To see a list of all recent dialed, received, and missed calls** press the recent calls button . The phone shows the **All Calls** list.

Press  and  to scroll up and down through the list of calls. Press  to call a highlighted number.

To exit the **All Calls** list and return to the idle external display, scroll to  **Back** and press **[OK]**.

## transfer music

**Before you transfer music to your phone:**

❶ Insert a memory card into your phone (see page 12).

**Note:** TELUS mobile music requires that you format the memory card (see page 14). All music files must be stored in the "my\_music" folder on the memory card. If you download music from TELUS, this folder is already created. If not, create the "my\_music" folder on your memory card (see page 31).

❷ Set your phone to **Mass Storage** mode by pressing  
 >  Settings > USB > Mass Storage.

❸ **Attach a Motorola Original USB cable** to the micro USB port on your phone and to an available USB port on your computer. A Motorola Original USB cable and supporting software may be included with your phone. These tools are also sold separately.



❹ Drag and drop songs or playlists onto the "my\_music" folder.

**Note:** Do not delete the "Mobile" and "Motorola" folders.

❺ When you finish, remove the phone safely from your computer:

- **If you are using a PC**, right-click the "Safely Remove Hardware" icon in the system tray at the bottom of your computer screen, then select "USB Mass Storage Device."
- **If you are using a Mac**, select and drag the "Removable Disk" icon to the Trash.

## TELUS mobile music—flip closed

Play music directly on your phone so you can listen to your favorite tunes while on the go.

❶ Make sure the touch sensitive buttons are unlocked (see page 27).

❷ Press the smart/speakerphone key to activate the touch sensitive buttons.

**Note:** If the external display is not already lit, press the smart/speakerphone key once to turn it back on, and a second time to activate the touch sensitive buttons.


Your phone displays the **TELUS mobile music** menu, with the **touch controls** at the bottom.

3 To control music playback:

touch controls	
<b>play/resume play</b>	Press ▶.
<b>pause</b>	Press II.
<b>skip to next song</b>	Press & release ► .
<b>skip back to previous song</b>	Press & release  ◄.

4 To exit the music player, open the flip and press .

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## music

### TELUS mobile music—flip open

To activate your phone's music player **while the flip is open**:

**Find it:**  >  Music & Media > TELUS mobile music

Your phone displays the **TELUS mobile music** menu. You can now browse, preview, download, and play music directly on your phone.

The **TELUS mobile music** menu includes:

option	
<b>All Songs</b>	Find & play a song. <b>Note:</b> All songs are listed here. If a song has <b>Artist</b> , <b>Album</b> , or <b>Genre</b> information, that information is included.
<b>Artists</b>	Find & play music by an artist.
<b>Albums</b>	Find & play music from an album.
<b>Genres</b>	Find & play music by genre (type of music) such as rock or jazz.

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## music

**Note:** If you can't find artist, album, or genre information for a song in **Artists**, **Albums**, or **Genres**, the information may not be available. All songs, with or without this information, are listed in **All Songs**.

During a song, the music player shows the song title, artist, album, and artwork, if available.

**Note: If you receive a call during a song**, the music player pauses the song until the call is over.


Use these keys to control the music player during music playback:

controls with flip open	
<b>play/resume play</b>	Press ▶.
<b>fast forward</b>	Press & hold ◂ right (for at least two seconds).
<b>next song</b>	Press & release ◂ right.
<b>rewind</b>	Press & hold ◃ left (for at least two seconds).

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## music

### controls with flip open

<b>previous song</b>	Within first two seconds of song, press & release ◃ left.
<b>return to song beginning</b>	After first two seconds of song, press & release ◃ left.
<b>scroll up/down through list</b>	Press ◂ up or down.
<b>turn off music player</b>	Press <b>Back</b> until you return to the <b>Music Player</b> menu, then press <b>Exit</b> .  <b>or</b> Press  .

### customize music player

**Find it:**  >  Music & Media > TELUS mobile music

Press **Settings**, then select **Repeat Song**, **Expand Cover**, **Song Information**, **Song Library**, **Music Player Home**, **Shop**, or **Help**.

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# camera

## take photos

The camera viewfinder appears on the external display when the flip is closed and on the internal display when the flip is open. **To get the sharpest photos, wipe the lens clean with a dry cloth before you take a photo.**

### take a photo—flip open

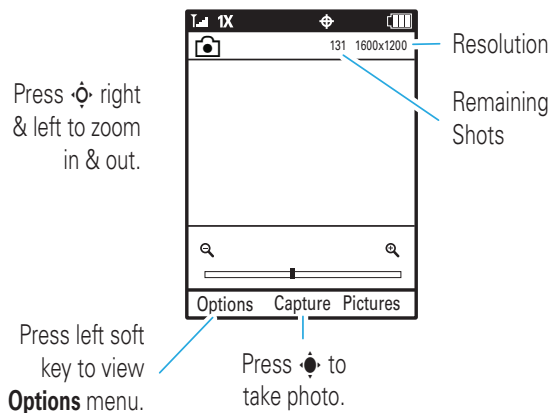
With the phone powered on and the flip open:


- 1 Press the camera/camcorder key  to activate the camera.

**Tip:** You can also activate your phone's camera by pressing  >  **Music & Media** > **Camera**.



Your phone shows the active camera viewfinder screen:




**Tip:** Press the camera/camcorder key  to toggle between the camera and camcorder.

- 2 Point the camera lens at the subject.

Press  right and left to zoom in and out.

**To view other options**, press **Options** (see page 40).

- 3 Press the center key  to take the photo.
- 4 Press **Send** to save the photo and send it in a message.

**Note: Network/subscription feature.**

Select **in Message** to immediately send the photo in a message, or select **Online Album** to first save the photo to an online album. You will then see the **Msg** screen. You can now send the photo in a message (see your *User's Guide* for more information).

**or**

Press **Save** to save the photo and return to the camera viewfinder.

**or**

Press **Delete** to delete the photo and return to the active photo viewfinder.

- 5 Press  to return to the main screen.

When the camera is active, press **Options** to view and select these options:

<b>Resolution</b>	Set resolution to <b>1600x1200</b> , <b>1280x960</b> , <b>640x480</b> , <b>320x240</b> , or <b>Picture ID</b> .
<b>Self Timer</b>	Set the camera to take a photo after a specific interval: <b>3 seconds</b> , <b>5 seconds</b> , or <b>10 seconds</b> . Or turn it off.
<b>Add Picture Frame</b>	Select a custom frame for your photo.
<b>Brightness</b>	Adjust image brightness by scrolling left or right from <b>-2</b> to <b>2</b> .
<b>White Balance</b>	Adjust for different lighting conditions by scrolling left or right to choose from <b>Auto</b> , <b>Sunny</b> , <b>Cloudy</b> , <b>Tungsten</b> , <b>Fluorescent</b> , or <b>Darkness</b> .
<b>Color Effects</b>	Scroll left or right to select <b>Normal</b> , <b>Antique</b> , <b>Black &amp; White</b> , or <b>Negative</b> .

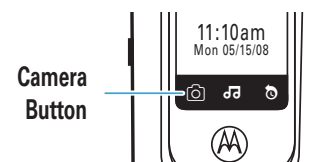
## take a photo—flip closed

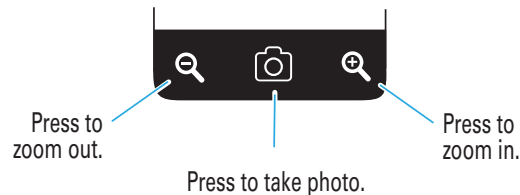

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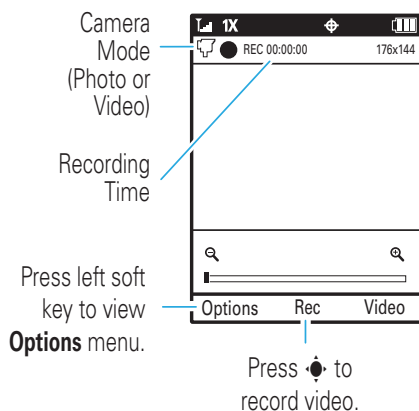

## record videos

- 1 Press and **hold** the camera/camcorder key to activate the camera.

**Tip:** You can also activate your phone's camcorder by pressing > **Music & Media** > **Video Camera**.

Your phone shows the active camcorder viewfinder screen:



**Tip:** Press the camera/camcorder key to toggle between the camera and camcorder.

- 2 Point the camera lens at the subject.  
Press right and left to zoom in and out.
- To view other options**, press **Options** (see the table following these steps).
- 3 Press the center key to begin video recording.
- 4 Press **Stop** to stop video recording.
- 5 Press **Send** to save the video clip and send it in a message.

**Note: Network/subscription feature.**

Select **in Message** to immediately send the video clip in a message, or select **Online Album** to first save the video clip to an online album. You will then see the **Msg** screen. You can now send the video clip in a message (see your *User's Guide* for more information).

or

Press **Save** to save the video clip and return to the camcorder viewfinder.

or

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## camera

Press **Delete** to delete the video clip and return to the active camcorder viewfinder.

6 Press  to return to the main screen.

When the video camera viewfinder is active, press **Options** to set video recording options:

option	
<b>Resolution</b>	Set resolution to <b>Large (320 x 240)</b> or <b>Small (176 x 144)</b> .
<b>Video Length</b>	Set the maximum length of video clips to <b>2 Minutes</b> , <b>5 Minutes</b> , <b>Fit to Memory</b> , or <b>Fit to MMS</b> .  <b>Tip:</b> To send your video clip in a multimedia message, the video length must be set to <b>Fit to MMS</b> .
<b>Self Timer</b>	Set the camcorder to begin recording after a specific interval: <b>3 seconds</b> , <b>5 seconds</b> , or <b>10 seconds</b> . Or turn it off.

<b>Brightness</b>	Adjust image brightness by scrolling left or right from <b>-2</b> to <b>2</b> .

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## Specific Absorption Rate Data

### This model wireless phone meets the government's requirements for exposure to radio waves.

Your wireless phone is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured not to exceed limits for exposure to radio frequency (RF) energy set by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) of the U.S. Government and by the Canadian regulatory authorities. These limits are part of comprehensive guidelines and establish permitted levels of RF energy for the general population. The guidelines are based on standards that were developed by independent scientific organizations through periodic and thorough evaluation of scientific studies. The standards include a substantial safety margin designed to assure the safety of all persons, regardless of age or health.

The exposure standard for wireless mobile phones employs a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. The SAR limit set by the FCC and by the Canadian regulatory authorities is 1.6 W/kg.<sup>1</sup> Tests for SAR are conducted using standard operating positions accepted by the FCC and by Industry Canada with the phone transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands. Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR level of the phone while operating can be well below the maximum value. This is because the phone is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a wireless base station, the lower the power output.

Before a phone model is available for sale to the public in the U.S. and Canada, it must be tested and certified to the FCC and Industry Canada that it does not exceed the limit established by each government for safe exposure. The tests are performed in positions and locations (e.g., at the ear and worn on the body) reported to the FCC and available for

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review by Industry Canada. The highest SAR value for this model phone when tested for use at the ear is 1.34 W/kg, and when worn on the body, as described in this user guide, is 0.97 W/kg. (Body-worn measurements differ among phone models, depending upon available accessories and regulatory requirements).<sup>2</sup>

While there may be differences between the SAR levels of various phones and at various positions, they all meet the governmental requirements for safe exposure. Please note that improvements to this product model could cause differences in the SAR value for later products; in all cases, products are designed to be within the guidelines.

- **Use your mobile device to call for help.** Dial 911 or other local emergency number in the case of fire, traffic accident, or medical emergencies.\*
- **Use your mobile device to help others in emergencies.** If you see an auto accident, crime in progress, or other serious emergency where lives are in danger, call 911 or other local emergency number, as you would want others to do for you.\*
- **Call roadside assistance or a special non-emergency wireless assistance number when necessary.** If you see a broken-down vehicle posing no serious hazard, a broken traffic signal, a minor traffic accident where no one appears injured, or a vehicle you know to be stolen, call roadside assistance or other special non-emergency wireless number.\*
